To your employer

To qualify, you must be:

- 1) A high school graduate or equivalent, and
- 2) A graduate of an approved program of study in Insurance and Coding or a working biller/coder with at least one year of qualifying, verifiable experience.

Is my program approved?

Ask your program officials. If not, have them call NCCT to submit the appropriate documentation to NCCT for consideration.

How do I stay current?
